My project again this year is the Ronald McDonald House in Providence. Many families have been given love and assistance when they need it the most. Won't you help to make this project a success?



GRAND LODGE SCHOLARSHIP

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE FOLLOW DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY AND COMPLETELY, FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN REJECTION OF APPLICATION

Applicant must use the current official Odd Fellows form which must be dated and signed by the Student, parent(s) or guardian(s) and lodge official(s) where applicable. All applications and statements are required to be signed. Typewritten applications are preferred or must be legibly handwritten.

Application and all supporting documents must be in English.

Official transcript of the student's records must be submitted. Records may be photocopies that bear an original signature of the proper authority.

The applicant shall prepare an essay of 250 words or less on the following topic:

"Should the USA be the 'gatekeeper' of the World?"

This must be typed, and enclosed with all supporting materials

Application will be disqualified if essay is not included.

A current dated and signed recommendation; Limited to **150 words or less**, from the Principal or Counselor in authority and one teacher at the school the applicant is currently attending is required. Each recommendation must be enclosed in a sealed envelope, signed over the seal and returned to the student for enclosure in the scholarship packet.

Include one letter of endorsement from a responsible community (NON-SCHOOL) person. **This**person should not be related to the applicant but can be a business person, minister or
civic leader. The person should be capable of reporting the applicant's participation in the
community in terms of work service, leadership, notable skills and outstanding recognition.
Do not refer to school accomplishments. This should be enclosed in a sealed envelope,
signed over the seal and returned to the student for enclosure in the scholarship packet.

INSTRUCTIONS CONTINUED

All parts of the application (application, essay, principal/counselor's statement, teacher's statement, non-school endorsement and official transcript) must be enclosed in one packet and must be returned to the Grand Secretary at the Grand Lodge office (before the February 1st deadline). Please allow ample mail delivery time! It is the responsibility of the applicant to consolidate all materials in one packet.

Applicant must be a resident of Rhode Island /Massachusetts and their sponsor must be a member of an Odd Fellows or Rebekah Lodge in the jurisdiction of Rhode Island.

Only those chosen to receive awards will be notified by the end of March and will be requested to attend our Annual Banquet on April 14, 2023 at the Wyndham Newport Hotel, 240 Aquidneck Ave., Middletown, Rhode Island at 6:00 PM, when the Scholarships will be handed out.

Applicant must have a letter from their Lodge or the Lodge of their Sponsor verifying that they or their sponsor are a member in good standing and shall bear the seal of the Lodge.

ROSE PARADE FLOAT — JANUARY 2, 2023

Starting January 1, 1908, the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs have had continual presence in the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA. The Odd Fellows Rebekahs Rose Float is a labor of love in which all services are volunteered. No one gets paid to work on the float or the organizing committee. The Odd Fellows Rebekahs Rose Float Organization is incorporated as a 501c(3) Charitable Corporation by the State of California.

The corporation is organized to provide an educational experience for the public by teaching volunteers to create and display a work of art in the annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena California. The corporation performs this objective by its ability to sponsor, plan, and design, build, decorate, and enter a float. The float is a work of art which is viewed by nearly a million people locally in Southern California and is televised to more than 70 million international viewers. The corporation endeavors to promote a culture of caring and sharing, and goodwill to all people everywhere via the themes of its floats, and seeks to elevate the character of mankind. What an experience many Odd Fellows and Rebekahs have had working and riding on the float.
